A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

Steven Dietz's *This Random World* is an extended contemporary rumination on the ways in which all of us are ultimately interlinked–often in ways we're unaware. The internet both facilitates and complicates our attempts to untangle many of these mysteries. After all, who hasn't Googled themselves, a friend or family member, a potential partner, or a would-be business associate--just for starters--and then consequently disappeared down an internet rabbit hole? And, what happens when one turns up another person that shares the same name?

A staple of the rom-com is serendipity-the beauty and thrill of chance meetings, our stars aligning, and the universe cooperating. *This Random World* upends this idea. The play's audience knows how each of these characters are interconnected. For the characters? This takes some time. Does everything happen for a reason? Or, as Scottie, the play's aging matriarch states: "Don't believe it. Everything is an accident."

This Random World is a tender, funny, bittersweet play. Disengagement, lives that don't go according to plan, fractured family ties, grief and mourning are all here. Yet, the play also suggests that if we listen, connect, and live with open hearts we have the ability to transcend and be renewed. The play's ending certainly suggests this.

I've admired Steven Dietz for a number of years. I was first exposed to this gifted playwright decades ago when I moved to Seattle. Days after my arrival I attended the premiere of his widely-produced play *God's Country*, a daring look at the rise of the white supremacist movement. Annually, Dietz is one of the United States' most produced playwrights. As you'll discover, Dietz's plays (which include *Private Eyes, Fiction, Lonely Planet, Foolin' Around with Infinity,* and *More Fun Than Bowling*) are unflinching examinations of troubled characters in postmodern predicaments. I'm thrilled to introduce this gifted playwright to Playshop audiences.
