VA Benefits Policy

It is the policy of Allegheny College to reward students receiving Veteran's Benefits as generously as possible. Allegheny College participates in the Yellow Ribbon Program and VA benefits are not counted as Other Financial Assistance in the calculation of demonstrated need for Federal and State grants. Allegheny College will not impose any penalty to a covered student (including late fees, the denial of access to classes, libraries or other institutional facilities) due to a delayed payment from VA. Additionally, Allegheny College will not require a covered student to borrow funds because of the individual's inability to meet their financial obligations due to a delayed VA disbursement.

If a covered student qualifies for the Yellow Ribbon program, Allegheny College will make a matching contribution with VA's Yellow Ribbon award **up to the cost of Tuition and Fees**. A covered student is also able to keep his/her merit award **up to the Cost of Attendance** after the VA Chapter 33 cap amount and Yellow Ribbon amounts have been awarded. If a covered student previously received institutional need-based grant, notably the Allegheny Grant, and it puts the student in a credit position after the VA benefits are awarded, then that award will be reduced so total award **does not exceed the Cost of Attendance**. The covered student's Basic Allowance for Housing (BAH) and book stipend will go directly to the student and will be in addition to Financial Aid awarded by Allegheny College. A covered student may still be eligible for federal work study or campus employment and federal student loans.

Prior to Allegheny College certifying enrollment, the covered student must complete the Allegheny College Certification Request form and provide the Financial Aid Office with a "Certificate of Eligibility" to authenticate their entitlement for educational assistance.

Please Note

* Covered students admitted prior to Fall of 2020 are grandfathered into the previous VA awarding policy.

* A covered student/individual is any individual who is entitled to educational assistance under Chapter 31 or Chapter 33.

* Allegheny College awards the majority of VA's Tuition Cap amount in the student's first certification term of the academic year.

* Allegheny College is not approved to use VA education benefits for study abroad programs unless the institution the student attends while abroad is authorized. If a student is not permitted to utilize their VA education benefits for an Allegheny sponsored abroad program, they may receive institutional merit and need-based assistance.

* Students will automatically be certified for each qualifying enrollment period unless written notification is submitted to the School Certifying Official indicating a different directive (Leave of Absence, Transfer, Decline Benefit, etc.).

Example: John Smith is a dependent of a veteran who is eligible to receive Chapter 33 benefits at 100% benefit level (qualifying for VA Yellow Ribbon). John has also received a merit scholarship for \$33,000.00 from Allegheny College.
